INTRODUCTION

Since the AGM, the Committee convened on two occasions: 25 January in McKee Barracks and on 22 February in Dublin Port. The Committee will reconvene on 26 April in Cathal Brugha Barracks Dublin, on 28 June and 27 September in McKee Barracks.

To-date, the Committee has developed the diary of events for 2018, conducted initial planning for the various activities, and successfully executed the Field Trip to Dublin Port on 22 February.

Communications

Commissioning Ceremony 93 Cadet Class: 26 January 2018



The Minister of State with special responsibility for Defence, Mr. Paul Kehoe T.D. accompanied by the Chief of Staff Vice-Admiral Mark Mellett DSM, attended the Commissioning Ceremony of 68 Army Officers, 2 Air Corps Officers and 8 Maltese Officers at the Defence Forces Training Centre, the Curragh Camp, Co. Kildare on Friday, 26 January 2018.

This is the largest number of officers to be commissioned in a single ceremony and, on induction, was the largest ever single intake of cadets.

The newly appointed officers completed a demanding 15 months intensive training and have taken up appointments as junior leaders in Óglaigh na hÉireann and the Armed Forces of Malta.

The 93 Cadet Class comprised of 8 officers who had previously served in the Defence Forces as enlisted personnel, and 31 university graduates with a range of qualifications including law, history, animal science, multimedia studies, music composition, and English literature. A further 17 officers were in third-level education prior to joining the Defence Forces.

Spike Island – World Travel Awards



Last December, Spike Island, which is featured in the Artillery Heritage section on home page of the Club's website, came second in the World Travel Awards, ahead of the Great Wall of China and Mount Kilimanjaro in Africa. First place went to the historic Inca Citadel of Machu Picchu in Peru.

Earlier in October 2107, Spike Island was named Europe's Leading Tourist Attraction. Over 45,000 individuals visited the island in 2017.

Following a $\in 6$ million investment, Cork County Council continues to develop the historic prison and fort as a tourist attraction.

Originally the site of a monastic settlement in the 7th century, Spike Island saw its first artillery fortification built in the 18th century by the British following the outbreak of the American War of Independence with a series of forts being built on the 104 acre island in both the late 18th century and early 19th century.

Used as a prison in the 19th century with thousands of prisoners transferred from Spike to Australia, the island remained under British control following the Anglo-Irish Treaty of 1921. Spike Island was handed over to the Irish Free State in 1938 on the departure of the British Army.

A working prison up until 2004, responsibility for the island was handed over to Cork County Council in 2010 and following an investment of over €6 million by the Council and Fáilte Ireland, the island reopened in June 2016 as a tourist attraction.

LOOKING INTO THE PAST

The following is an extract from an article published in An Cosantóir November 1973, titled "Coast Defence Artillery", written by Commandant J.E. Dawson HQ Southern Command and Lieutenant Cormac Lalor Coast Defence Artillery Southern Command.

"On 21st May, 1946, Col. Tom Feely wrote a letter which commenced 'Fort Shannon will be evacuated on 31st May, 1946.' Thus ended a Coast Defence presence in the Shannon Estuary which began when troops from Cork Harbour Forts and Kildare Barracks occupied the newly-built fort.

The estuary was a controlled port, and in 1941 it was decided that the examination service at the beautiful little port of Cappa on the Clare side would need artillery support. To this end a C.D.A. installation would be built near Tarbert in Kerry, and would be named Fort Shannon. The installation would have a battery of 6" guns, D.E.L., and a platoon of machine-guns.

A five-acre plot of land was bought from a local landowner. Leasing arrangements were made with others on whose lands local defence posts were to be built. Lookout posts were built so that by day and night visual communications would augment wireless and telephone.

Thus Kilcraudaun Head, Loop Head and the examination service on the North were linked with Doon Head, Scattery Island and the Fort. The harbour master at Limerick, with Naval rank of Lt. Comdr. was responsible for the entry of all shipping into the estuary. Close liaison was vital between his office and the Fort.

Comdt. Mick Sugrue came from Fort Davis to assume command and he also enters history as the man who closed it down. As there was no heavy Coast Defence equipment apart from this Fort between Bere and Lough Swilly, he and his men had an onerous task.

Like all our men of World War II period the gunners in Fort Shannon preserved our sovereignty and neutrality by ensuring that a potential invader would think twice. But the men in the estuary are best remembered for the assistance they gave with lights and equipment when the coaster M.V. E.D.J. was driven on the rocky coast near Cappa by a gale in 1945. In a letter to the Fort Commander the managing director wrote: " fortunately no lives were lost, but the .story would have been otherwise were it not for your help, without which we would not have got our crew ashore."

Fort Shannon was designed and built to kill, but on that January night the resources and experience of its gunners and engineers were used to save life. Their training was not wasted."
