GOVERNANCE

Focus

The Artillery Club's current focus remains on: organising activities, revising the Club's Rules, developing a Website, extending its Membership base and participating in appropriate ceremonial and commemorative events.

Committee

Since the AGM, the Committee convened on three occasions: 15 January, 26 February and 30 April. The Committee will reconvene on the following dates: 23 June, 24 September and 04 December (before the AGM on the same day).

Since the AGM, the Committee approved the Information Brief, issued Newsletters 1/2015 and 2/2015, developed an iterative list of activities for 2015 and approved the Clothing catalogue. Currently, the Committee is actively addressing the Membership Drive, the Chief of Staff's Portrait, a revision of the Club's Rules, the development of a Web Site and a Window Insert in the Garrison Church McKee Barracks.

DFHQ Officers' Mess and Auditorium have been booked for the Annual General Meeting and Saint Barbara's Day Lunch scheduled for 04 December.

Membership

Membership of the Artillery Club is open to all serving and retired commissioned Artillery officers of the Permanent Defence Force and the Army Reserve.

Arising from recent Banking procedures, the means by which Membership Subscriptions are paid were revised. In tandem, the Membership Application form was also revised. Both documents were proved by the Committee on 30 April and are attached to this Newsletter for appropriate action by potential new members and those with outstanding subscriptions.

Under the leadership of the Membership Secretary – Colonel Seamus McDermott (Retd), the current Membership Drive, consists of two stages:

Stage 1 - 26 Feb to 23 June. Serving PDF and AR personnel;

Stage 2 – 26 June to 24 September. Retired PDF and AR personnel.

As at 16 June, following an internal membership audit, the Club's membership roll shows 123 members, 101 of which are active members having paid the €10 subscription for 2015. The balance of 22 reflects lapsed members, some of whom go back to 2007.

Rules - Revision Process

During its February meeting, the Committee agreed that revised Club Rules should be presented for approval at the AGM on 04 December 2015, necessitating the circulation of draft rules to all members NLT 07 November (28 Days before AGM).

On 30 April, the Committee approved the proposed Headings for the Revised Rules. The Rules will provide for the following Sections: Title, Mission and Objectives; Membership; Governance; Financial Matters; Meetings; and Miscellaneous Provisions.

The first draft of the Revised Rules will be presented to the Committee at its June meeting. It is envisaged that the circulation of the final draft to the Club's membership will be approved during the Committee's September meeting.

Web Site

The Club registered a Website Domain in January 2010, www.artilleryclub.ie

The Committee has approved the nominal financial expenditure covering the technical design of the Website.

Lieutenant-Colonel Stuart McNamara CIS Corps has kindly agreed to be the Project Manager and will sponsor the hosting of the domain on Register365 and the installation of WordPress software. He has also offered to act as the initial Webmaster and will provide training to the Club's designated Webmaster who will take over the duties NLT 04 December.

The Committee has approved the Site Map, Home Page Format and the initial text for the sections covering the Home Page (Welcome Message), About Us, Membership and Links. These items were passed to the Project Manager on 16 June.

Website Timeframe

On 23 April: Committee approved Website Action Plan (V 23 Apr 15). Committee authorised the President to engage with the Project Manager. Committee scopes suitable photographs for the Website. Dedicated Social Media endorsed by Committee.

NLT 23 June: Initial Site Map provided to Project Manager, including Masthead Slider on Home Page. Having been approved by Committee, appropriate text for key sections provided to Project Manager, (including Home Page, About Us Section, Membership Section and Links Section). Website Designer appointed. Dedicated email requirements provided to Project Manager (President, Secretary, Treasurer, Webmaster). Committee briefed on the "under construction" Website. Committee approve of nominal Annual Costs.

NLT 24 September: Construction of Website at an advance stage. Committee to formally approve content of posted Sections on "under construction" Website.

04 December: Formal launch of Website at AGM. Club's Webmaster fully trained by Project Manager. Project Manager withdraws from Website project.

The Committee has approved the Club's Clothing Catalogue, kindly produced by Commandant C. O'Flanagan (Retd), listing garments (Jackets, Polo Shirts, Headdress, Tie and Bow-tie), sizes and price list. An Irish version of The Artillery Club title is available on request. Window Insert - Garrison Church McKee Barracks

On 30 April, the Committee was briefed on the associated Design and Costings for a Window Insert. Having conducted a recce of the Garrison Church, the Committee authorised Commandant Richie Armstrong (Retd) to advance the process, with an expenditure of €450, and having the Club's Logo inserted in the first window on the left hand side of the Church. It is envisaged that the window will be dedicated during the Annual November Commemorative Mass.

The Royal Artillery School, Segovia -April - Coordinator: Comdt Michael Flood (Retd)

During the period 25 through 29 April, the Artillery Club's visited the Spanish Royal Artillery Academy in Segovia. 17 Participants, including 3 Spouses, took part. On arrival in Madrid on Saturday 25 April, the Party spent two days in the capital visiting places of interest. On Monday 27 April, the Party departed Madrid and spent two very enjoyable days in Segovia accommodated in a hotel located at the foot of the Aqueduct of Segovia, one of the best-known monuments in Spain and Europe. Courtesy of our Spanish hosts, the Party visited the Artillery Academy and participated in tours of Segovia and the Alcazar, home of the Artillery Academy (1796 – 1862).





The Royal Artillery Academy is the principal training establishment for artillery warfare in the Spanish Army. The core of the Academy consists of three main areas: Teaching, Research and Simulation. During the course of a conducted tour of the Academy, the Party visited the Library, Church and Museum, had lunch in the Officers' Mess and received a comprehensive briefing on the Simulations currently used by the Spanish Artillery Corps.





Presentations to the School Commandant Brigadier-General Alfredo Sanz y Calabria included one from the Chief of Staff Lieutenant-General Conor O'Boyle, and one from the Artillery Club.

LOOKING INTO THE PAST

The ACK-ACK

(Extract from an article written by Comdt C.P. O'Halloran, Artillery School published in the November 1973 edition of *An Cosantóir*.)

"The story of the AA really begins with the departure of an arms purchasing mission to England in 1927; while there, they purchased 4 anti aircraft guns, consisting of 2 two-wheeled and 2 four-wheeled 3in 20 cwts. These duly arrived from England in March 1928 and were stored in Islandbridge Barracks, which was then an Ordnance Depot."

"The record from this point until a date in 1931 is not at all clear except for one bright spot – the record shows where Lieut M.P. McCarthy (now Lt Col Retd) was sent to England to undergo an Anti-Aircraft Artillery Course at Larkhill in the latter half of October 1929, and he arrived back in early January 1930. What is certain is that the "Anti-Aircraft Battery came into being on the 16 September 1931."

"On the 16th September 1931, the Final issue of Daily Routine Orders for the Artillery Corps, as it was then established, contained the new organisation in accordance with the terms of DFR No 57 of 1931 (Peace Establishments 1931/1933) and thus the Corps was strengthened by the new inclusion of a new unit The Anti-Aircraft Battery".

"Routine Order No 7 of the Anti-Aircraft Battery was published on 17th September 1931 and included the place of parade: Troops of the Anti-Aircraft Battery will parade on the EAST SQUARE, the right hand marker in line with the 25 yards from the EASTERN END of building No 130 (utensil store 2)."

"The total inclusive strength of the Battery on formation was 2 Officers and 48 other ranks. The original party of pioneers helped to lay the foundation for the expansion of World War 2 and the basis on which the present AA Regt rests. The two original officers [Lt Maurice P. McCarthy and Lt James J. Dolan] were later O/C and 2 I/C of the AA Brigade during the 1940s."

If you wish to set up the Standing Order manually, you will need the bank proforma, which is obtainable from your bank, and also on-line for the Bank of Ireland.
