#### **Gunner James Magee – Defender of Values**



This year marks the 220th Anniversary of Gunner James Magee's heroic action at the Battle of Ballinamuck, County Longford, the final military engagement of the 1798 Rebellion.

In addition to paying homage to Saint Barbara, patron saint of gunners worldwide, the Artillery Corps is unique within the Defence Forces, in that it has an historical figurehead, namely Gunner Magee, from who derives some of the Corps rich heritage and enduring values of respect, loyalty, selflessness, physical courage, moral courage and integrity.

Under the auspices of the Artillery Club, in order to enhance the Artillery Community's understanding of Gunner Magee, on 02 October, a paper was circulated marking the anniversary of his heroic stand, which took place on 08 September 1798. #### **Display: Morris Commercial CDSW Quad 6x6 Gun Tower - ZC 5835**



One of the Artillery Club's prescribed objectives is to support military and regimental museums, in the acquisition, preservation, maintenance and display of Artillery weapons, equipment, material and artefacts.

The Artillery Club's Committee is grateful to the extended Peacock Family in making available, on a loan basis, one of the surviving Morris Commercial CDSW Quad 6x6 Gun Towers, from the 19 original tractors which went into service in 1938.

On Friday, 09 November, acting on behalf of the Artillery Committee, Col Seamus McDermott (Retd), supported by RSM John Morris (Retd), received the Gun Tower, on loan, from Mr Matthew Peacock, and arranged its transportation to the Curragh Military Museum. The cost of transporting the quad from Leeds to the Curragh was paid from the Club's museum expense account.

On Monday, 12 November, the Gun Tower which has been in the Peacock family for generations and in pristine condition, went on display in the Artillery Gallery of the Curragh Military Museum, with its original registration plate *ZC* 5835.

# Arty Decades' Reunion - Anniversary of PDF, FCA and AR Commissioning 1948-2018, 13 September (Col Mick Smyth Retd)





The Annual Decades' Reunion, now in its third year, took place on Thursday, 13 September 2018 in The Military College, Defence Forces Training Centre.

The 2018 Reunion focused on Gunner Officers from the Permanent Defence Force, An Fórsa Cosanta Áitiúil and the Army Reserve, commissioned in 1948, 58, 68. 78. 88, 98, 2008 and 2018. Incidentally, no Gunner Officer was commissioned in 1958 or 1988.

We were honoured to have in our company Lt Col Jim Dawson (Retd), who as a member of the 20<sup>th</sup> Cadet Class, was commissioned, 70 years ago, in September 1948. He was born three years after the establishment of the Artillery Corps, in Callan, County Kilkenny, on 12th April 1926, On commissioning, he was appointed to the Artillery Corps, completed his YO's course, and was posted to the 2 Fd Arty Regt. Following service with the 1 Fd Arty Regt, he was posted to Spike Island where he developed his renowned and legendary expertise in the art and science of Coast Defence Artillery. Retiring in 1986, his overseas service was with the 1 Infantry Group in the Congo, and with the Force Headquarters in Cyprus.

On arrival in the Cadets' Mess, the Group was received by the Mess President Cadet Shay Byrne and members of the 94 Cadet Class, including the Cadet Captain Cadet Conor Heffernan Cadet Dylan Caruana from Malta, and the class photographer Cadet Ivan MacDonald.

During Coffee, participants were able to view memorabilia from their cadetship and visit the mess facilities. Thereafter, Cadet Tristan Fogerty and Cadet Cormas Nellis displayed current equipment on issue to Cadets.

During a comprehensive briefing, Commandant Cathal Keohane, 2 i/c of the Cadet School provided an insight into key areas pertaining to cadet induction and training. Finally, the Group adjourned to the Officers' Mess for a most enjoyable lunch.

We remain grateful to Lieutenant-Colonel Gavin Young for making the resources of the Cadet School available throughout.



Pending the approval of the appropriate authorities, it is envisaged that the 2019 Decades' Reunion will be held in The Military College on Wednesday, 11 September for Gunner Officers commissioned in 1949, 1959, 1969, 1979, 1999, 2009 and 2019.

#### **Foreign Field Trip Vienna: 07 – 11 October – Cordinator: Comdt Michael Flood (Retd)**



The Artillery Club's 2018 Foreign Field Trip took place in Vienna, from Sunday, 07 October through 11 October. The trip centralised on a visit to the Austrian Artillery School, in Zwölfaxing.

In addition to the Artillery School, the programme included visits to the Permanent Mission of Ireland to the OSCE, the HGM-Kliege (Austrian Military Museum), and the Spanish Riding School.

As in the successful trips in 2015 to Madrid and Segovia, in 2016 to Granada and Malaga, and in 2017 to Lisbon, Commandant Michael Flood (Retd) was the Tour Coordinator.

Participation in the Field Trip was open to members of the Artillery Club and their spouses, or partners. 29 individuals, including 11 spouses participated in the Foreign Field Trip.

On arrival in Vienna, following a review of the coordinating instructions in NH Wien Belvedere, Rennweg, the Group dined in O'Connor's Gasto Pub.



Availing of public transport, on 09 October, the Group visited the HGM-Kliege in Ghegastresse, which is the leading museum of the Austrian Armed Forces. On our arrival, we were formally welcomed by Dr Franz Broedl, following which he provided us with an overview of the museum's building and its history, an insight into the numerous galleries, before conducting us on a comprehensive tour of focussed displays on both the Ground and Upper Floors. The tour included the Hall of Fame, Archduke Franz Joseph's Assassination in Sarajevo on 28 June 1914, the Navy, and the First World War, which included the armoured cupola from Fortress Przsemysl, and the last remaining 38cm siege howitzer, (range 15,000m, weight 81,700kg, 740kg shell).



Thereafter, the Group assembled in the Permanent Mission of Ireland to the Organisation of Security and Cooperation in Europe. On arrival, they were accorded a formal reception by H.E. Mr Kevin Dowling. On behalf of the Artillery Club, Brigadier-General Paul Pakenham made a presentation to the Ambassador, which was followed by briefings from Colonel

Michael Kiernan OSCE Military Representative, and Lieutenant-Colonel Harry O'Connor Staff Officer High Level Planning Group. With 57 participating States, the OSCE is the world's largest regional organisation and is engaged in 16 field operations in South-Eastern Europe, Eastern Europe, the South Caucasus and Central Asia.

On 09 October, availing of a private coach, the Group travelled to Zwölfaxing, the location of the Austrian Artillery School and were received by Colonel Franz Kraßnitzer. Following refreshments, Colonel Kraßnitzer provided a wide ranging brief on Austrian Land Forces College's impressive outputs supporting the Austrian Armed Forces, and the activities of the Artillery School – "*Exempla Docent*". On behalf of the Group, Brigadier-General Paul Pakenham (Retd) presented Colonel Kraßnitzer with an engraved tankard and the Club's plaque.

Major Wolfgang Trooper coordinated an impressive display of equipment which included a mission tailored Fire Control System, the Drohnen System Unmanned Aerial Vehicle, the VBS3 Simulations, and a Target Surveillance System. The visit concluded over an enjoyable lunch hosted by the Artillery School.



On 10 October, the Group attended *Morning Exercise with Music* at the Spanish Riding School which provided an insight into the years of training of the Lipizzaners and their riders. Accompanied by classical Viennese music, the Group witnessed the riders and their horses executing relaxing exercises aimed at refining and perfecting movements.

The Hail and Farwell took place in the Huth Restaurant, Schellinggasse, marking the end of a most rewarding and enjoyable Foreign Field Trip, encompassing the Artillery School, the Austrian Armed Forces Museum, the Organisation of Security and Cooperation in Europe, and the Spanish Riding School, coupled with finding sufficient time to visit local attractions such as the Schönbrunn Palace, Hofburg Palace, St Stephan's Cathedral, Belvedere Palace, and the Naschmarkt.

The Artillery Club remains grateful to Commandant Michael Flood (Retd) who planned and executed the successful and memorable 2018 Foreign Field Trip to Vienna.

#### Units' Annual Mass and Wreath Laying - 10 November

The Annual Commemorative Mass for deceased personnel of the 2 Field Artillery Regiment, 62 Field Artillery Regiment (FCA), 7 Field Artillery Regiment (FCA) and 2 Air Defence Battery (FCA), took place in the Garrison Church, McKee Barracks on Saturday 10 November. #### Gun Salute Bere Island 26 September

On Wednesday, 26 September, a ceremony was held on Bere Island to commemorate the 80th Anniversary of the handover of Fort Berehaven, on 30 September, 1938.

The event was arranged by the Bere Island Projects Group. The ceremonial element of the event was led by 1 Artillery Regiment and took place at the Rerrin Redoubt, the site of the original 1938 handover. Families of those who Defence Forces personnel who participated in the handover were present at the ceremony.





The ceremony commenced with an Honour Guard for the Cork County Mayor Cllr Gerard Murphy, under the command of Sgt Alistair Forsyth. Following speeches, the County Mayor was escorted to the Rerrin Redoubt by GOC 1 Bde Brigadier-General Patrick Flynn and 2 IC 1 Brigade Artillery Regiment Commandant Peadar O'Catháin.

The Last Post was sounded followed by the raising of the National Flag to full mast at exactly 1201hrs. The raising of the National Flag to full mast by Lieutenant James McKeon of 1 Brigade Artillery Regiment coincided with the exact time of the handover of Fort Berehaven to Irish Authorities in 1938.





After the raising of the National Flag, reveille was sounded, followed by a 21 Gun Salute under the command of BS Kevin Murray using three 25 Pounders. The military ceremony concluded after the National Anthem, played by the 1 Brigade Band under the baton of Captain Brian Prendergast, and an Air Corps fly past.

Work is in progress for the restoration of Lonehart Battery as a visitor attraction.

# LOOKING INTO THE PAST

#### Some Thoughts on the Irish Artillery Corps

Almost a decade ago I began to put pen to paper (or, more accurately, finger to keyboard) to attempt to trace the history of the Irish Artillery Corps since 1922, ultimately resulting in a book by that same title. The reader might well ask how and why a retired U.S. Army officer of Italian parentage became interested in Irish military history, and of the Artillery Corps in particular; the best explanation I can give is that many, many years ago I ran across an article in An Cosantóir about the Comet tank in Irish service, which led me to write a book about armored vehicles in Irish service, which in turn led to somewhat of an obsession with the Artillery Corps.

Be that as it may, I recently was asked if I would consider writing an article for the Artillery Club Newsletter, an honor I am not sure I merit.

After some consideration, I thought that it might be appropriate to highlight some of the milestones of the Artillery Corps, as well as some of the episodes, some amusing and others, unfortunately, tragic, that most impressed me as I researched the history of the Corps.

I am fully cognizant of the fact that I may in large measure be preaching to the choir, and that despite the fact that I have published a book on the subject, most those who read this article may well be more aware of the proud history of the Corps than I am.

I can only hope that those of you who do read the article find it interesting, accurate, and perhaps at least minimally informative.

With that, let me lower the muzzle, chamber a round, and fire at point-blank range.
