
Organisation of the Artillery Corps 1923 - Present 1923 (DFR No 3), Total = 1 Battery



Artillery Corps established on 23 March 1923.














Original Ack Ack Battery in 1932 with the 3" gun.












A.A. DEFENCE OF DUBLIN.












- The 1st Mortar Troop went to Congo with 42 members and their 120mm mortars.
- Distinguished service medals awarded to Capt John Boyle, Sgt Jack Quirke & Cpl Billy Allen.
- The Heavy Mortar Troop fought 7 days over 180 miles.



38 Inf Bn - Hy Mor Tp Congo - October 1962 - April 1963

- While serving with the 36th Battalion in the Congo, Sgt Mulcahy was wounded by mortar fire but refused to leave his platoon, and received another wound that proved fatal.
- Sergeant Mulcahy was posthumously awarded the DMS. He left behind four young children.
- received the Military Medal for Gallantry for bravery at At Tiri in South Lebanon.


